Notice of Amendment to Qualifying Papers

Florida Statutes, Section 99.061, provides that all qualifying papers must be filed by the end of the qualifying period. The statute reads, in part:

If the filing officer receives qualifying papers that do not include all items . . . prior to the last day of qualifying, the filing officer shall make a reasonable effort to notify the candidate of the missing or incomplete items and shall inform the candidate that all required items must be received by the close of qualifying. A candidate's name as it appears on the ballot may not be changed after the end of qualifying.

What this means to you as a candidate is that no additions or amendments may be made to your qualifying papers after the close of qualifying.

The statute further provides that:

If a candidate's check is returned by the bank for any reason, the filing officer shall immediately notif the candidate and the candidate shall have 48 hours from the time such notification is received, excluding Saturdays, Sundays, and legal holidays, to pay the fee with a cashier's check purchased from funds of the campaign account. Failure to pay the fee shall disqualify the candidate.
